## **Rights, Democracy and Migration – Challenges and Opportunities**

The 12<sup>th</sup> IMISCOE/1<sup>st</sup> nccr – on the move Conference will be held in Geneva June 25 – 27, 2015. The conference is organized by the Swiss Forum for Population and Migration Studies (SFM, University of Neuchatel) and the Institute for Demographic and Life Courses Studies (University of Geneva). The conference covers the topic “Rights, Democracy and Migration – Challenges and Opportunities”. We welcome contributions from various disciplines, such as political science, sociology, economics, history, law, anthropology, public administration, demography and social geography. Submissions directly related to the conference theme are welcomed as well as those on other topics in the broad field of migration and ethnic studies. Proposals can be submitted for papers as well as panels and workshops (all 90 minutes):

### **Papers**

Submission of papers should include a 250 word abstract. Individual papers will be thematically clustered into panels.

### **Research panels**

Proposals for a research panel should consist of max. 4 coherent and related papers. Submission should include a 250 word abstract of the theme of a panel, a chair and discussant, and the titles, author names and a 250 word abstract for the papers included in the panel.

### **Workshops**

This can involve book workshops or policy workshops. The aim of such workshops can be to discuss research or rather to shape a future research agenda. Workshop proposals should include a max. 400 word overview of the rationale of the workshop and the workshop program, including the names of the persons – academic as well as non-academic – taking part in the workshop.

Deadline for submitting proposals is January 15 (24:00 CET). Submissions can be made via the online webportal at [IMISCOE.org](http://IMISCOE.org). Applicants will be informed about acceptance of their submission by February 15.

The conference fee is €200; for PhD students the fee is €150. Members that have already been registered via their IMISCOE member institute will receive a waiver for the fee. The fee includes all conference materials, lunches, coffee breaks and dinners, as well as social events. A one year individual membership of IMISCOE is also included in the fee, which gives access to various benefits.
