This research project aims to identify factors which influence international students in their mobility/migration behaviour.

To answer the first research question by describing international students, a newly created data set will be analysed.


Research Questions

- 1) What are **socio-demographic characteristics** of international students staying in Switzerland after graduation?
- 2) What patterns of **trajectories** can be identified during their stay in Switzerland?
- 3) What are influencing **factors** for international students to stay or to leave Switzerland?

Possible Factors

- Socio-demographic differences
- Cultural and linguistic proximity
- Social ties (marriage & children)
- Legal status (EU/non-EU)
- Labour market demand and conditions for specific disciplines
- Bilateral agreements and policies
- Duration of stay in Switzerland
- Order of events in trajectories

Statistical Analysis

Creation of a new statistical data set by linking two registers:

- the foreigner register (ZEMIS)
- the student register (SHIS)

Some Facts & Numbers

- 25% was the share of international students in 2014
- 31'105 international students
 were enrolled at Swiss universities
- 29% of the international students came from non-EU 3896 countries: 2839 1736 1265 897 123 South **Africa** Europe Asia North Oceania America America (non-EU/EFTA)
