About the nccr - on the move

The nccr - on the move is a national center of competence in research funded by the Swiss National Science Foundation. It seeks to stimulate the interdisciplinary field of research on migration and mobility in Switzerland and develop new perspectives on the changing migratory reality. Managed from the University of Neuchatel, the network comprises seventeen research teams from seven universities in Switzerland: The Universities of Neuchatel, Basel, Bern, Fribourg, Geneva, Lausanne and Lucerne. It brings together research projects from social sciences, economics and law. The nccr - on the move offers some 40 doctoral and post-doctoral fellowships to highly talented researchers in the field.
