




## Book Launch

### About the Book

This collective book aims at documenting today's migratory reality in Switzerland. It focuses, among others, on three aspects of the Migration-Mobility Nexus: labor market participation of recent immigrants, their family ties as well as their inclusion in the social and political spheres. Based on the underlying assumption that migration and integration have become increasingly complex phenomena in this mobile world, it provides a combination of empirical and theoretical analyses of the current situation in Switzerland. This book is the result of an interdisciplinary collaboration of 17 researchers, who have exploited a unique source of data, the Migration-Mobility Survey conducted within the framework of the nccr – on the move.

### Short Description of the Event

Ilka Steiner and Philippe Wanner, the editors of the volume, will be present and highlight some of the main findings of the book. Their introduction will be followed by a speech by Laura Morales, Professor in Political Science and Comparative Politics at Sciences Po Paris, who will position the Migration-Mobility Survey within the European setting. The presentation will be followed by a small reception to celebrate the book launch.

### About the Invited Speaker

Since 2017, Laura Morales has been coordinating the project ETHMIGSURVEYDATA COST – International Ethnic and Immigrant Minorities' Survey Data Network – which brings together researchers, policy makers, and survey data producers. The project aims at improving the access, usability, dissemination and standards of survey data that measure the economic, social and political integration of ethnic and migrant minorities.
