LAW - federal level

Swiss Citizenship Act – SCA

- Total revision, entered into force in 2018
- First step of the "integration step model" The allocation of welfare benefits becomes a means of migration control and civic stratification

Foreign Nationals and Integration Act – AIG

- Partial revision, entered into force in 2019
- Implementing "integration step model"
- Mandatory and unsolicited reporting from social services required
- Further restrictions for third-country nationals to access welfare benefits in discussion


Welfare benefits become an explicit reason for exclusion through deportation

Institutional Structures

How are control mechanisms realized through institutional exchanges?

How do institutional structures affect respective bureaucratic practices?

PUBLIC ADMINISTRATIONS

- Obligatory data exchange about welfare benefits between offices
- Increased communication regarding the assessment of "integration" and deservingness
- Different professional ethics
- Different interests
- Communication among and between social services and migration offices to establish common practices and legitimize decisions

(Re)production of the national community of solidarity and the imaginary of a socially cohesive society entitled to welfare benefits

- Debates on integration requirements and exclusionary policies and practices (Favell 2022; Goodman 2010; Korteweg 2017), by analyzing civic stratification (Morris 2002).
- 2 Discussions on social cohesion (Midtbøen 2015; Schiefer & Noll 2017) through its focus on politics of belonging (Yuval-Davis 2007), giving particular attention to the welfare state and welfare chauvinism (Andersen & Bjørklund 1990).
- 3 Relational understanding of decision-making by street-level bureaucracies (Brodkin 2012; Eckert 2020; Lipsky 2010; Miaz & Achermann 2021)

How is the notion of 'integration' interpreted in relation to social welfare benefits?

CANTONAL MIGRATION OFFICES

- ✓ Use of law to discipline foreign nationals Bureaucratic practices of communicating, menacing and warning
- Pressure from communes to (not) revoke permits

Migration offices take over the role of social services by reducing costs of welfare benefits and "activating" non-citizens

LOCAL SOCIAL SERVICES

- Obligation to communicate foreign nationals' reception of welfare benefits and "integration" to the cantonal migration office Border guard proxies: Social services take over the role of migration offices, by monitoring and assessing the "integration" of non-citizens
- Disciplinary measures and control mechanisms for all recipient
 - Civic stratification through sanctioning of social assistance beneficiaries
 - Political economy of an administrative organization

The categorization of individuals as foreign nationals allows the state to increasingly establish conditional access to, and punishment of, receiving (national) welfare benefits.
