Research Questions

- How do people experience, make sense of, and live through societal crises?
- How are people's sensemaking, imagination, and im/mobility entangled during crises?
- What do different crises mean for different people?
- What is the function of writing in times of crises?

Approach


Using quantitative (NLP) and qualitative methods simultaneously to navigate the (vast) longitudinal data.

Sentiment line (or emotional tone in the writing) indicates crises and significant events in people's lives, which orient qualitative analysis.

Contributions to NCCR

We emphasize the individual experience of crises, when crises entangle, and how crises manifest in people's life course. We add an experiential dimension to more macroperspectives.

We also study (im)mobilities and the changing role they play in people's life.



Planned Projects


- Crises resonating through time

- From 2000 to 2021
- 42 diaries
- 80.000+ entries
- 35+ million words
